

Education – Getting it sorted

If you think that your child may have Special/Additional Educational needs ([SEN](#)), you may need to find someone who will take the time to listen and discover for themselves what your child is like and what he or she needs. It might have taken you years of devoted attention to piece together your own insights and it may take some time for others to catch up with you. It might help to keep things factual, describing the specifics of what is happening, and leaving the professionals to join up the dots.

Getting what your child needs often puts parents up against difficulties and obstacles. Professionals may try to fob you off to begin with suggesting that things might sort themselves out – perhaps partly because they do not see your child at home. There are waiting lists for much needed services and the solutions may not be easy to identify.
